Ladies and Gentlemen,

As Chancellor, I wish to take this opportunity to congratulate all GLUK graduands who have today qualified to receive the University's Certificates, Diplomas, and Bachelors and Masters degrees in their respective academic disciplines. These are no doubt major achievements and milestone in your lives. Not everyone who has aspired to these milestones has achieved them. Many have not been fortunate enough to make it this far for various reasons. This is therefore an event for you to cherish.

The degrees being conferred on and the diplomas and certificates being awarded to you today are foundations on which to build your futures. I encourage you to progress further in your academic pursuits so as to gain new knowledge, acquire advanced skills, and become more competitive globally.

As I salute the graduands, I also pay special tribute to the University academic staff, who have spared no effort to prepare the students throughout the duration of their course work and programs. They have no doubt carried out their duties with diligence and dedication. I also thank the parents, guardians, and sponsors for the sacrifices they have made over the years to educate their children, the results of which we are able to witness today.

To the graduands: Education is an investment. The Kenya government's developmental plan commonly referred to as 'Vision 2030' relies heavily on an educated Kenyan workforce. The Kenyan Government, together with your parents, guardians, and sponsors have invested in you a great amount of resources to enable you scale this academic ladder. I appeal to you to utilize the knowledge you have acquired for the benefit of communities, society, and humanity in general. In every

task to which you will be assigned, apply yourself with tenacity, even as you approach every challenge with serenity and fortitude.

I congratulate the current University Governing Council: You have been entrusted with the crucial task of providing oversight and strategic direction for this University at a very important time in its existence. I do not doubt your ability to deliver.

I thank the University Management under the leadership of the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Atieno A. Ndede-Amadi, for competently and courageously implementing the Governing Council's policies as well as the innovative strategies laid out in the developmental plans of the University. I also recognize the student body in general for your role and active participation in the success story of this University.

The world as we know it today is undergoing tremendous changes at a very rapid pace. Our attempt to catch up with the rest of the world, if ever, must be made through high quality education. It is only education, and not resources like oil, that will bring about prosperity to Kenya and the region. The Arab world has recognized this and in spite of its riches in oil, it is now spending huge amounts of resources on creating centres of excellence.

In the past, under the infamous Structural Adjustment Programmes, the World Bank took the position that developing countries needed to emphasize primary education rather than tertiary education. This is debatable since the role played by tertiary education in the changing world cannot be possibly over emphasized. We need these centres of excellence. We must establish ourselves on the cutting edge of knowledge.

It is very important to note that constructive partnerships between government and university leadership is a critical element in the transformation process of higher education.

I encourage the GLUK academic fraternity to fully utilize the new research structures within the University in order to propel both research and academics to even greater heights. I appeal to these academicians to conduct research that address contextual problems. It is high time our own academicians focused on research aimed at providing solutions to our own developmental challenges, as a country but also as the African continent.

However, I want to urge you to balance research with teaching responsibilities. Lecturers should proactively seek more innovative, practical and hands-on methods of facilitating entrepreneurship education, for example. There is need to experiment with a range of approaches to make the teaching of entrepreneurship as close to reality as possible. Focus should be on entrepreneurship because education for its own sake is vanity.

As parents, we must start encouraging our children to venture into private businesses. These children can shine in this space more than we can imagine. If you can afford to help your daughters and sons start up a small business, by all means do so and do not hold back. Make no mistake about it, all jobs, white-collar or blue-collar, are offshoots of entrepreneurial endeavors.

To the graduands today, the knowledge you have acquired through studying Agribusiness, Community Health, Community Development, Nursing, Community Nutrition, Information Technology, Business Administration, Clinical Medicine, Hospitality and Tourism, among others - use them as stepping stones to strategic arenas of critical thinking, by participating in public dialogue on the fight against corruption, among other vices; sensitizing people on poverty eradication strategies; as well as on other socio-economic issues affecting Kenyans and humanity in general.

Finally, my special recognition and appreciation goes to the University Senate for successfully preparing this 2018 cohort but also for organizing this auspicious ceremony.
